IF YOU OWN OR OPERATE A POWERBOAT OR PERSONAL WATER CRAFT (PWC), NEW CANADA-WIDE REGULATIONS REQUIRE YOU TO HAVE A PLEASURE CRAFT OPERATOR (PCO) CARD.

As of September 15, 1999

All operators born after April 1, 1983 must have a PCO card.

As of September 15, 2002

All operators of power driven, pleasure craft under 4 metres, including PWCs must have a PCO card.

As of September 15, 2009

All operators of power driven water craft must have a PCO card.

The Community Services Department is now offering the opportunity to obtain your PCO Card through the Lifesaving Society's Boat Operator Accredited Training (B.O.A.T.). B.O.A.T. provides everything that you and your family need to know to pass the Canadian Coast Guard accredited test.

2 WAYS TO ACQUIRE YOUR PLEASURE CRAFT OPERATOR CARD

1. Challenge the Test

Purchase your B.O.A.T. Study Guide at the Community Services Department office, study it, then write the accredited exam at scheduled times.
