SMOKE ALARMS: MAKE THEM WORK FOR YOU!

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on each level of the home, including the basement.
- Ensure smoke alarms are hardwired or use a 10-year sealed, nonreplaceable battery type*.
- Verify that smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or don't respond when tested.

OFF-ROAD VEHICLE USE

WHEN CAN YOU DRIVE ON MUNICIPAL ROADS?

- ONLY as a direct access from the operator's point of origin to the nearest recognized traditional trail, and as a means of direct access from the nearest recognized trail to the operator's point of origin.
- No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on a highway within the Municipality of Marathon between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 7:00 a.m.

SOME BASIC RULES

- No person shall drive an off-road vehicle on a highway at a rate of speed greater than 20 km/hr.
- Off-road vehicles shall yield the right-of-way to vehicles.
- Off-road vehicles must be equipped with working muffler, and not be modified.
- No additions to tires that may damage the highway This includes chains, studded tires.
- No person shall operate an off-road vehicle in such a manner that it causes or is likely to cause a risk to the safety of any person.
- Off-road vehicles shall be subject to all regulations and by-laws governing the parking of vehicles within the Municipality.
- All operators MUST be 16 years of age or older AND possess a minimum of G1 licence to be on the road – This includes crossing
- · All passengers of an ATV driven on a road MUST be a minimum of 8 vears old.

ENFORCEMENT & PENALTIES

- This By-law may be enforced by a Police Officer or a Municipal Bylaw Enforcement Officer.
- Contravention penalties provided for the Provincial Offences Act. the Ontario Highway Traffic Act, and the Off-Road Vehicles Act.
- Minimum fines start at \$105.00
